### DOWNTOWN Under Construction 2019 Chris McGahee, Economic Development, City of Dulut

Fall Festival patrons have visited a downtown under construction since 2015. The 2019 edition of Duluth Fall Festival is no exception. These are some of the projects you can see during your visit:

Parking Deck/Marriott Courtyard: A new 100 room Marriott Courtyard sitting on a two story 324 space parking deck is under construction behind the **Duluth Festival Center**. Projected opening is March 2021.

Lennar Homes: Lennar Homes started construction of South on Main in January 2019 on 60 townhomes and 34 single family detached dwellings on what was former

industrial property on Hardy Street.

Willbrooke Trail: The City of Duluth purchased a single family home in the adjoining subdivision known as Willbrooke. The city demolished the home and created an access trail and passive park called Willbrooke Trail. The innovative project creates a walkable path into downtown for these residents.

Home South **Townhomes: Home South** has started site work on the corner of Davenport and Main Street on 20 new townhomes.


New Restaurants and

Shops: Parsons Alley has opened two new restaurants since the 2018 Fall Festival. Local on North opened early 2019 and is located next to Good Word Public Brewing and Public House Nacho Daddy opened February 2019and is located next to The Chocolaterie. Main Street Saw the opening of VomFass Oils and Vinegars next to Truck and Tap. Peace Love and Decorating next to **Eye Candy Art Studio** has opened its Christopher Radko Ornament Shop. **65** Brewing is under construction next to O4W Pizza. Spool School is located under Duluth Yoga next to Pure Taqueria. Main Street Mediterranean opened

behind Crave Pie and The Farmhouse.

The construction won't stop there. In October 2019 Greystar will be building a 180<sup>°</sup> unit active adult 55+ complex at the corner of Hardy and Hill Street. The Duluth Branch of the Gwinnett County Library will start site work in November or December 2019. It will be located next to the **Calaboose** on Main Street.

So, Downtown Duluth continues to grow. However, it has managed in the process to keep the wonderful small town feeling that it has been known for since it was chartered in 1876.




### About the Cover

### COME SEE GWINNETT'S LARGEST PARADE!
















### Grand Marshal: Scott Slade


### Honorary Grand Marshal: Wallace Lail

Honorary Grand Marshal of the 2019 Duluth Fall Festival Parade is Dr. Wallace Lail. In 1969, Wallace established his dental practice in Duluth. So, 2019 marks the 50th Anniversary of Lail Family Dentistry!

Wallace earned his B.S. at Emory University, and his D.D.S. from the University of Tennessee. After graduation, Wallace served in the U.S. Army Dental Corps. He has served on many health professional boards, including Chairman and President of the Hinman Dental Society. He has won numerous dentistry awards, and is a Fellow of the American and International College of Dentists. Scott is a rare two-time winner of the National Association of Broadcasters Marconi Award as Best Radio Personality in America and was recently nominated for the Radio Hall of Fame. In 2000, he initiated the WSB Radio Care-a-Thon for the AFLAC Cancer Center, raising millions of dollars to fight children's cancer.

Scott has been a commercial airplane and helicopter pilot, and among his hobbies enjoys hiking, playing jazz saxophone, and, of course, flying. He is an Atlanta native and a graduate of Georgia State University. In January 2020, Scott will celebrate his 50th Anniversary on the air, with the majority of his career at WSB. Scott is the nephew of 2019 Honorary Grand Marshal, Wallace Lail.

Wallace has also been an active civil servant to the City of Duluth, including Chairman of Planning and Zoning, City Councilmember and Mayor Pro Tempore. He was a charter member of the Gwinnett Rotary (serving as Secretary and President) and a Board member of Citizens Bank of Gwinnett. His hobbies include hunting, fishing, relaxing at in his cabin in the North Georgia mountains and flying his restored 1938 Stearman Biplane. Wallace is married to Mary Slade Lail. The couple has three sons (Ray, Slade and Brandan) and 13 grandchildren. Slade (recently voted best dentist in Gwinnett) and other relatives practice at Lail Family Dentistry, enabling Wallace to reduce his weekly working hours. His nephew, Scott Slade of WSB, is our Grand Marshal.



# 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Joan Glancy Hospital

he untimely deaths of two children—Olin Burnett, the 6-year-old son of a Duluth dairy worker, and Joan Glancy, the 4-year-old daughter of a wealthy Detroit industrialist—are, in a big way, responsible for Gwinnett's first hospital.

Henry Burnett was employed at Irvindale Dairy in Duluth when his son, Olin, died unexpectedly. He turned to the dairy's owner, Dick Hull, who stepped in to help. While getting burial clothes at Parsons store, he talked with Kate Parsons and was shocked to learn that there were no medical facilities in the whole area. He asked her to get the Duluth people together the next week.

At the meeting at the schoolhouse Hull asked the people to help him start some kind of clinic. Inspired by Dick Hull, they found a little house in Downtown Duluth, owned by the school system, which agreed to let them use it. The people of Duluth, black and white alike, got together and fixed up the little house, and the clinic was opened later that year in 1941. Although the South was still segregated, Dick Hull insisted, and the Duluth people agreed, that there be equal facilities and equal treatment for all,

Hull told his father-in-law, General A.R. Glancy, head of the Pontiac division of General Motors in Detroit, what the people were trying to do. Glancy's 4-year-old daughter, Joan, had died 17 years earlier because health care was not available where they were on vacation. He sent a sizable donation to Duluth in memory of Joan. And thus was born the idea of Joan Glancy Hospital!

The clinic was an immediate success, but all soon realized that it wasn't enough. General Glancy



challenged the Duluth community to buy land, clear it, and dig a well, and then he would build them a hospital.

On Sunday, July 9, 1944, Joan Glancy Memorial Hospital was dedicated. Duluth had a big celebration honoring the Glancy's and all the children who had been born in the little clinic. The first baby born there, Glancy Jones Dunn, will be a special guest in the Duluth Fall Festival parade this year. Hospital Healthcare providers will walk behind the hospital lead cars.

In the years since, there have been many changes

in Duluth's healthcare. In 2006, a new hospital, GMC-Duluth, was opened, and the old Joan Glancy Hospital became a rehab and wellness center. The 75th Anniversary of Joan Glancy will be featured in the Festival Parade.

Now, the Gwinnett Hospital System has merged with Northside Hospital. Duluth people are very pleased with the new name of the old hospital - Northside Gwinnett Joan Glancy. This name pays tribute to its history of helping improve the lives of Gwinnett County residents for 75 years. Now, with this new partnership, it is on track to continue this mission for many years to come.

### **GETTING HELP OR FIRST AID**



If you need help while you are visiting the Festival or if you lose an item, stop by our revamped Information, Lost, & Found booth with the Duluth Fall Festival logo (located on Main Street). You can also ask any volunteer for assistance.

Although we hope that you don't need it, the Duluth Fall Festival probably has the best First-Aid station of any Arts & Crafts festival. The station (located near the railroad tracks) is staffed by Registered Nurses furnished by Northside Hospital Duluth and includes the Concussion Care-A-Van for urgent care.

Generally, first-aid matters consist of bee stings and minor injuries. For major emergencies, ambulances are within calling distance to quickly transport patients to the Duluth hospital. Police escorts are also on hand to assist.

Cheryl MacMillan, head of nursing at Northside Duluth chairs this important committee. We appreciate Cheryl, the nurses, and Northside Hospital Duluth for providing this invaluable service.

### ABOUT THE FESTIVAL T-SHIRT AND CONCERT

You may have noticed the Duluth Fall Festival's new tagline "More Than Just a Festival." We adopted this phrase because our volunteer activities and accomplishments run year 'round. By now, you are probably familiar with the large fall concert and the huge arts and crafts event that we host annually in September, but you might not know the other things that the Festival does.

This spring, the Festival donated \$75,000 to the City of Duluth to enhance the entertainment that we have all enjoyed all summer. During holiday season, the Festival sponsors the annual tree lighting illuminating the two giant Christmas trees and decor (purchased by the Festival) that adorns the Town Green and Parsons Alley.

Taylor Park (next to City Hall) and Parsons Alley were joint ventures with the City. The DFF erected the Continental Divide Marker on the Town Green and commissioned the mosaic outside Dreamland BBQ, as well other art objects. Our biggest accomplishment was building the Duluth Festival Center and stage that hosts countless events.



The Festival supports the City in events, special projects, continued beautification and all sorts of improvements. For example, the Festival has pledged \$250,000 for the proposed train viewing platform to be built near the new library and have already donated \$65,000 for its design. All total, the Festival has donated more than \$3 million to Downtown Duluth. But, even more important than these physical things, the Festival develops lifelong friendships among its members. At its core, this volunteer organization builds our great community through monthly meetings and nights out, sponsor events, a Summer Rally, a volunteer Christmas party and numerous planning meetings for our 55 separate committees.
